## What is College Credit Plus?

College Credit Plus is Ohio's dual enrollment program where students earn both high school and college credit at the same time

- Students may apply to any public or participating private college
- Students may apply to multiple colleges

## Who is Eligible?

- → Students in grades 7-12
- → Ohio residents
- → Students who meet academic eligibility standards, which are determined by the State
- → Students who are "College Ready"

## What does it mean to be "College-Ready"?

## More than just academically ready

- ◆ Emotional and social transition
- ◆ Meeting college expectations
- ◆ Time management and organizational skills
- ◆ Ability to self-advocate
- ◆ Some college classes have content that is oriented toward a mature or adult student. College instructors will not modify the course content for CCP students.

Starting in the 2022-2023 academic year, Ohio requires new CCP students and parents to complete a Mature Content Permission Slip.

## How is College <u>Different</u> from High School?

	High School	College					
Tests	Weekly or end of chapter	Fewer in number, but cover more material					
Study Time	1 to 3 hours per day	2-3 hours per credit hours					
Graded Work	Numerous quizzes, tests, and homework	Fewer tests & assignments, but worth more points					
Learning	Information provided mostly in-class. Out-of-class research is minimal	More independent thinking, longer writing assignments, & out-of-class research					
Responsibility	Daily verbal reminders in class	Email reminders, checking courses online daily					
Attendance & Class Participation	Required, parents are notified if a student is absent	Attendance policy is determined by instructor, but no one is notified if a student is absent					
Role of Parents	Parents are involved, working closely with teachers and counselors	The college views the student as an independent decision maker					

#### **FERPA**

- The "Family Education Rights and Privacy Act"
  - Protects student education records
    - Parents do not have access to student's academic records
    - Colleges reserve the right to communicate student record information with appropriate high school officials who have an "educational need to know"
    - "Permission to Release Information Form" student's written consent to share information with a third party
      - For example: at *Lakeland*, this must be student initiated with photo ID at the Student Service Center

## What are the **Benefits** of CCP?


#### Students can:

- Earn high school & college credits at the same time
- Get a "head start" on career plans
- Start & potentially complete a degree or certificate program
- Understand the expectations of college life
- Save tuition & textbook costs
- Demonstrates to colleges that you are "college ready"

### **How Many Credits can Students Take?**

- Up to 30 credits per academic year, includes high school classes:
  - $\circ$  Calculation: 30 ( \_\_\_\_ high school units x 3) = \_\_\_ (max CCP credits)
  - $\circ$  Example: 30 (3 high school units x 3) = 21 CCP credits
- If a student enrolls in more than 30 credits, they can either:
  - O Drop the course (during the 100% refund period) or
  - Pay for the <u>entire</u> course (including tuition, fees, books) at the college's standard rates

#### When Can Students Take Classes?




- Summer is the lead academic term
- Student athletes should know summer term CCP courses cannot count for athletic eligibility for that academic year

#### Where Can Students Take Classes?







\*The option to take courses at the high school is only available if the high school has partnered with a college or university to offer courses at the high school

## What Courses can Students Take?

- College courses in subject areas that will satisfy high school graduation requirements
  - Students must work with high school counselors to ensure they are meeting any mandatory testing or other high school requirements
- Courses in a career pathway that interests them
- Courses that are major or degree requirements
- Students must meet prerequisites for all courses they take
- Students must complete their first 15 credits in Level I courses, which are transferable to public Ohio Universities. (See College/University's website for a list of Level I courses)

#### Non-Allowable Courses

 Private applied courses with one-on-one instruction (such as performing art lessons)

Study abroad courses

Physical education courses

Pass/Fail graded courses

• Remedial courses or sectarian/religious courses

#### **Grades & GPA**

- CCP grades earned in college courses are the same grades that will appear on the high school transcript
  - Chardon- A "W" or "Withdrawal" is not placed on the student's HS transcript
- Grades will be factored into the high school and college GPA
- Must successfully complete the courses in order to earn the credit
  - Even if a student fails or withdraws from the course, the college transcript and high school transcript will reflect the student's final grade

### Will my Credits <u>Transfer</u>?

- Most courses will transfer, especially from one public college to another public college
- Students must check with colleges to confirm transferability
- Visit <u>transfercredit.ohio.gov</u> or <u>transferology.com</u> for more resources

### **Underperforming Students**

- If students do not earn a passing grade or withdraw too late from college courses, the high school may require students/families\* to reimburse the tuition that the district paid
- The grades that students earn will be on the students' college transcripts permanently
- If a student fails or withdraws often, future financial aid may be negatively impacted
- If a student performs poorly, they may be placed on CCP Probation or CCP Dismissal or on academic probation or may be dismissed by the college
  - \*If a student is considered "economically disadvantaged", a school may not seek reimbursement

Lakeland allows students to withdraw from a course within the first 2 weeks for a full refund.

- If you a fail a course, you will be billed for the cost of the course
- If you register for a course, drop the course with Chardon, but forget to drop it with Lakeland
  officially, you will (likely) be billed for the cost of the course
- If you withdraw from a course after the first 2 weeks, you will be billed for the cost of the course

1 credit at Lakeland = \$120

#### What <u>Support Services</u> are Available?

- High School counselor
- College advisors/counselors
- Colleges provide the same academic supports to CCP students as they do traditional students
  - Learning Center/Tutoring
  - Library Access
  - Advising/Counseling
  - Accommodations

## **CCP at Lakeland!**

- Over 1,350 CCP students
- 23% of all Lakeland students
- 37 high schools
- 81% attend part-time
- 30% participate in CCP only at their high school
- Lakeland has over 140 degree & certificate programs
- Lakeland is ranked one of top 50 Best Community
   Colleges in the nation (College Consensus, 2020)
- In 2019, Lakeland was named the safest college campus in the nation (ADT)





## **Lakeland Opportunities:**

- Honors Program (Available to High School Seniors with a GPA of 3.5 or higher)
  - Honors Curriculum, motivated peers, leadership opportunities, honors distinction, ease of transferring into a partner college/university's honors program, scholarship opportunities
- Lakeland offers classes that are 16-weeks, 12-weeks, or 8-weeks.
- CCP students have the first TWO WEEKS to drop a course at 100% refund, in any term

- Career Services
- Parking is FREE at Lakeland!

## **CCP Career Pathway!**

- CCP students can earn credits towards job-ready certifications!
  - Makes them employable immediately after high school
  - Can be packaged with other certificates, associate degrees, or bachelor's degrees to make candidates look more marketable to employers in a competitive job market
- These programs all offer Ohio Department of Education (ODE) approved industry-recognized credentials, aligning with Ohio's new graduation requirements.
- CCP admission criteria for these specific programs include a GPA of 2.75 or above & a "B" or better grade in high school English.

## **CCP Eligibility Requirements at Lakeland!**

Students entering 10 <sup>th</sup> , 11 <sup>th</sup> , or 12 <sup>th</sup> grades with an unweighted, cumulative High School GPA of 3.0 or above	<u>OR</u>	ACT English - 18	<u>OR</u>	SAT Evidence-Based Reading & Writing - 480	<u>OR</u>	Accuplacer Next-Generation Writing Test - 263
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Students must meet the college readiness standards for English.



## **ACCUPLACER**

#### Prepare!

- A FREE placement exam created by College Board (SAT)
  - Next-Generation Writing Test
  - Next Generation Math Test (Currently in or completed Algebra 2)
- Do NOT take the test without preparing first!
  - Lakeland's FREE "Test Prep" website
    - ✓ Learn the test's format
    - ✓ Lakeland test prep workshop
    - ✓ College Board Next-Generation ACCUPLACER Placement Test Study App
    - ✓ Longsdale Online Course & Practice Tests

#### Take!

- REQUIRED Bring photo ID or College Board Student ID Form
- Sign up is required online (must apply to Lakeland first)
- Test takes place on campus
- Not timed
- Uses computer-adaptive technology (the response to each question determines the difficulty level of the next question)
- Multiple choice
- Students have 2 attempts to meet the threshold (a 3rd attempt may be allowed if student participates in a test prep activity)

Students who utilize test prep resources, on average, improve their score by 8 points on the writing test & 10 points on the math test!









