

### What is College Credit Plus (CCP)?

#### CCP is Ohio's dual credit program

- → Students can earn both high school & college credit
- → Ohio residents in grades 7-12; enrolled at a public/private high school or homeschooled
- → Take a variety of courses at any public & participating private colleges in Ohio
- → Courses held at the high school, on a college campus, or online

### Who Can Participate?

- → Students in grades 7-12 that are:
  - Ohio residents
  - Meet academic eligibility standards (determined by the State)
  - ◆ Be "College Ready"
- → Students must maintain satisfactory completion of CCP courses/GPA (returning CCP students)

### Academic Eligibility Standards

- → Have a cumulative unweighted high school GPA of at least 3.0
   -or-
- → Have a cumulative unweighted high school GPA of at least 2.75 and an "A" or "B" in a relevant high school course
   -or-
- → Have a remediation-free score on the ACT, SAT or Accuplacer
  - Students entering 7th-9th grade must submit test score
  - CHS 10th & 11th grade students take ACT at CHS on March11th
    - ACT English of 18, ACT Reading of 22 or ACT Math of 22.
    - SAT Evidence-based Reading & Writing of 480 or SAT Math of 530.

### What does it mean to be "College-Ready"?

More than just academically ready

- ◆ Emotional and social transition
- Meeting college expectations
- ◆ Time management and organizational skills
- ◆ Ability to self-advocate
- ◆ Some college classes have content that is oriented toward a mature or adult student. College instructors will not modify the course content for CCP students.

Ohio requires new CCP students and parents to complete a Mature Content Permission Slip.

### Benefits of CCP

- → Maximize credits earned (1 class = credit in high school & college)
- → Head start on career planning, degree earning and/or certificate completion
- → Experience college early to understand the expectations of college courses
- → Save tuition and textbook costs

### Differences Between HS & College Courses

	High School	College
Study Time	Required homework ranges between 1-3 hours per day	2-3 hours of studying/reading for each hour of class
Knowledge Acquisition	Information provided mostly in class, assignments to follow what was covered	Out-of-class work in advance of in-class discussion
Tests	Given weekly or at the end of each unit	Less frequent and cover more material



### Differences Between HS & College Courses


	High School	College
Grades	Numerous quizzes, tests, homework assignments, etc.	Fewer tests and few homework assignments
Role of Parents/Guardian s	Guardians advocate, involved and work with teachers & counselors	Student has more responsibility; guardians more of a mentor/support
Accommodations	Parents and students work with high school staff to determine what assistance or accommodations can be made for students with IEPs or 504 plans	Students must work directly with college staff to determine if accommodations are needed; IEPs and 504 plans may or may not be included in the discussions



### Where Can Students Take CCP Courses?








The option to take courses at the high school is only available if the high school has partnered with a college or university to offer courses at the high school. At Chardon High School, this partnership is through Lakeland Community College.

### How Many Classes Can Students Take?

- → Students may be enrolled in up to 30 total credits per year, which include high school courses:
  - ◆ Calculation: 30 (HS units x 3) = max CCP Credits/Year
  - ◆ The max number of college credits a student can complete while participating in the program is 120
  - ◆ If a student enrolls in more than 30 credits for the year, they can:
    - Drop the course prior to the no-fault withdrawal date
    - Pay for the entire course at the college's standard rates

### When Can Students Take CCP Courses?



- → Summer is the first term of the calendar year
- → Student athletes should know summer term CCP courses CANNOT count for athletic eligibility for the academic year.

### What CCP Courses Can Students Take?

- → Courses in subject areas that will satisfy high school grad reqs
  - Students must work with high school counselors to ensure they are meeting any mandatory testing or other high school reqs
- → Courses that will count toward the gen ed requirements of a college/university (Ohio Transfer 36)
- → Courses in a career pathway that interests them
- → Courses that are major or degree requirements
  - Students must meet all prereqs for all courses taken
  - ◆ Students must complete their first 15 credits in Level I courses

### Course Eligibility Rules

- → Non-allowable courses include:
  - Private applied courses with 1:1 instruction (such as performing art lessons)
  - Courses with high fees
  - Study abroad courses
  - Physical education courses
  - ◆ Pass/fail graded courses
  - Remedial courses or sectarian/religious courses

### Additional Considerations

- → Grades
  - ◆ Final grades earned in the college course are the same grade that will be on the high school transcript
  - CCP course grades will be factored into the high school & college GPAs
- → Grade Weighting
  - High schools must weight all advanced standing courses in a subject area consistently (CCP, AP, IB, Honors)
  - CHS weights CCP courses on a 5.0 scale

### Athletic Eligibility

- → Student athletes should:
  - Learn the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) requirements
  - Know that summer term CCP courses cannot be used to bring a student into compliance with the OHSAA requirements for interscholastic athletic participation
  - Demonstrate passing courses mid-term to maintain eligibility

### Transferability

- → Ohio Transfer 36: 36-40 sem credit hour courses in English, math, arts/humanities, social sciences & natural sciences guaranteed to transfer to any of Ohio's public institutions of higher ed
- → Certain general education & technical courses will transfer, especially from one Ohio public school to another
- → Students must check with colleges to confirm transferability

### FERPA "Family Education Rights and Privacy Act"

- → Protects student education records
  - Parents do not have access to student's academic records
    - Attendance, registration, In-progress grades, early warning indicators.....
  - Colleges reserve the right to communicate student record information with appropriate high school officials who have an "educational need to know"
  - "Permission to Release Information Form" student's written consent to share information with a third party
    - For example: for *Lakeland*, this <u>must be student initiated</u> with photo ID at the Student Service Center

Ohio Dept of Education FERPA Explanation

### Financial Consequences/Considerations

- → If you a fail a course (F, FNA, Inc.), you will be billed for the cost of the course and the textbooks
- → If you withdraw after the no-fault deadline, you will be billed for the course
- \*Lakeland allows students to withdraw from a course within the first <u>2</u> weeks for a full refund.\*
  - ◆ If you register for a course, drop the course with Chardon, but forget to drop it with Lakeland officially, you will (likely) be billed for the cost of the course and the textbooks
  - ◆ If you withdraw from a course after the first 2 weeks, you will be billed for the cost of the course

### CCP Probation & Dismissal

### Support for CCP Students

- → Students receive support from both the HS and college:
  - High school counselors continue to provide assistance to all College Credit Plus students
  - College advisors provide course selection assistance
  - Colleges must provide the same academic supports to CCP students such as tutoring, library access, advising, etc.

### **Accessibility Services**

- → CCP students with disabilities in Ohio can receive accommodations
- → Students must follow the below steps in order to request accommodations for their CCP classes:
  - Register with their college's Accessibility Services office
  - Provide documentation of their disability
    - May include physical or educational diagnosis, copy of IEP/504, and any additional information required by college
  - ◆ This should be done BEFORE the course begins as many institutions will not retroactively apply accommodations

### Intent to Participate Form

- → Students must complete the Intent to Participate Form & submit it to their high school by **April 1**, **2025** 
  - Only way CCP students can receive state funding
  - Not a binding contract can always decide not to participate
  - Separate from the college application
  - On the form, students indicate a tentative plan to use Option B for payment of the CCP courses

### Chardon CCP Timeline Checklist

- Attend / Watch a <u>CCP Informational Session</u> / complete attendance form
- ☐ Complete <u>CCP Intent to Participate Google form</u> by April 1, 2025
- ☐ Apply online at lakelandcc.edu/apply (or college of your choice) use personal email
- Complete the <u>CCP Permission Slip</u> (Part of online application or paper version to be mailed)
- Request CHS transcript from Mrs. Giddings
- Send <u>ACT scores</u> or schedule Accuplacer, if applicable
- ☐ Check your **personal email** for your acceptance confirmation
- Once accepted, complete <u>CCP Online Orientation</u> (check your college email for this)
- ☐ Meet with college advisor (new CCP student only) to schedule your classes
- Meet with Office of Accessibility (if applicable) for students on <u>504 or IEP plans</u>
- Register for your courses by May 1, 2025 (all CCP application materials must be complete at this time).



CCP students must meet the college readiness standards for English



- Students entering the 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, or 9<sup>th</sup> grade must take the Accuplacer placement test.
  - FREE test prep resources are on Lakeland's website

  - Create an account
  - Complete the CCP Application (Social Security Number required)

- Complete the CCP Permission Slip and send to CCPinfo@lakelandcc.edu (form available on Lakeland's website or in Chardon Guidance office)
- ☐ Prepare & take the ACCUPLACER Exam or submit ACT/SAT scores (if needed



### APPLICATION PROCESS & ORIENTATION REQUIRED MATERIALS MAY DIFFER BY INSTITUTION

- » Meet state eligibility standards
- » CCP Application (only new applicants)
  - » Returners will fill out CCP Continuation Form via their KSU email mid-late January
- SAT/ACT scores or Accuplacer scores are an optional credential. Applicant decides to submit or not.
- » Official high school transcripts
- » Recommended 3.0+ GPA
- CCP Permission Form
  - Signed by student and parent

- » Kent State Application Deadlines
  - » Summer 2025 April 15
  - » Fall 2025 June 1
  - » Spring 2026 October 15
- » Attend Mandatory Orientation
  - » All new students must complete a CCP orientation.
- Complete Mandatory Advising
  - » All students both new and returning are required to meet with an academic advisor before scheduling courses.

#### **CCP ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

LAKE ERIE

- Application for Admission (*lec.edu*)
- Preferred Cumulative (Overall) GPA of 3.0 in High School Courses
- High School Counselor Recommendation Form
- Standardized Test For Course Placement
  - ACT or SAT
  - Reading Accuplacer at Lake Erie College

Test scores are NOT required if GPA is above a 3.0 and student is entering 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, or 12<sup>th</sup> grade

### DEADLINES FOR LAKE ERIE COLLEGE\*

- April 15<sup>th</sup>: Deadline to Apply to LEC
- May 17<sup>th</sup>: Deadline for Accuplacer (if needed)
- May 31<sup>st</sup>: Deadline for Course Registration
  - This is for students taking classes through Lake Erie College, and not through a partnership program with their high school
- Once accepted, students will participate in a CCP orientation
  - More information to come on orientation
