2. End of Course Exams: April 29 - May 3

Just a reminder for End of Course Exams and MAP testing next week (April 29 - May 3):

- 1. Math 8, Algebra I, and Geometry will be on Monday (4/29).
- 2. Science 8, Biology, and AP Government will be on Wednesday (5/1). Please note: All AP Government students will be taking the Government EOC on this date.
- 3. Government (not AP) and American History, and Math 8 and Algebra I MAP tests, will be on Friday (5/3).

Testing locations for testing students will be posted outside the **Main Office**, the **Clinic**, and **Room 200**. Please see Mr. Higham if you have any questions.

Buses will run at regular hours; supervision will be available in the CHS cafeteria for non-testing students who report during the testing window.

Please note:

- Students not testing are not required to report until 2nd period on Monday (4/29) and Wednesday (5/1).
- **1st period** will begin for **all students at 8:49 a.m.** on **Tuesday** (4/30) and **Thursday** (5/2) as listed on the schedule below.
- Students are **only required to** attend **on Friday (5/3)** if they have an **EOC** or **MAP test**; there is no school for students not testing.

Important note for **Auburn students not testing**: it is expected that you **attend your Auburn classes as usual**. Buses will run at regular hours.

33. A Note from the Nurse's Office

Just a friendly reminder for parents/guardians and students, regarding the procedures we follow at CHS when a student is feeling unwell and would like to go home early from school:


- Students need to report to the clinic to be seen/evaluated/communicate with the nurse (or another available staff member if the nurse is unavailable).
- Nurse Jackson or another staff member will reach out to parent/guardian regarding the health needs or status of the student and determine or recommend if a student should be sent home early from school.
- If a student reaches out to a parent or guardian directly requesting that they be picked up to go home due to illness/injury, etc, we ask that parents/guardians redirect their student to go and see the nurse first. An exit pass must be issued by the nurse if a student is going home with an illness/injury.
- An exit pass will be issued to a student **after** parent/guardian contact has been made by the nurse.
- Please note that parents/guardians are also welcome to call the office/attendance line or send in a written note to the office if you anticipate that your child will need to leave school early for an appointment or other reasons.
- Thank you for your understanding and cooperation with following these procedures. Our priority is to keep your student safe, accounted for and of course, help with any health needs that arise.
