

SURVEY RESULTS OVERVIEW



Telephone interviews performed by specially-trained opinion research interviewers

Conducted with 501 randomly-selected registered voters, residing within the Chardon Local School District, using a combination of valid residential, VOIP and cellular telephone listings

+/- 4.37% overall estimated margin of error, with a confidence interval of 8.74% within which the results can vary

May 8 - May 12, 2017

Data was stratified so that the differences in vital characteristics, such as age, gender and geography, are represented in proportion to their percentages of the district's electorate


Due to rounding, not all results add up to 100%, and the data is presented in a different order than the questions were asked

Unless otherwise noted, only statistically-significant differences that were outside the confidence interval for the overall estimated margin of sampling error have been reported in this presentation of key findings




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







In your opinion, how would you rate the job that the Chardon Local School District does spending tax money and managing its budget?















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

Have space to offer full-day kindergarten free-of-charge for students whose parents wish to enroll them?


Reduce the total number of buildings in the school district, in order to reduce costs and operate more efficiently?


Locate the consolidated new school buildings in a single centralized location near the existing high school?

Open-Ended Question







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- Overall, 74 percent of Chardon LSD voters said that Geauga County was moving in the right direction
- Overall, 62 percent of Chardon LSD voters said that the Chardon Local School District
 was moving in the right direction, including 77 percent of parents and 55 percent of nonparents, indicating general contentment with the school system
- If a new operating levy is not approved or pursued, a 35 percent-plurality, including 39 percent of parents, favor privatizing services to balance the budget, while 22 percent, including 26 percent of parents, prefer to close some of the buildings
- There also were substantial and significant differences in results based on partisan registration, which suggest that the timing and intraparty competitiveness of a primary election could prove to have decisive effects on the outcome of funding requests
- In contrast, there were very few sizeable differences in results based on gender, which is somewhat rare among education funding issues
- 32 percent of voters indicated they had children in their homes enrolled in Chardon Local School District schools (parents), and 9 percent indicated that they rented their homes

Other Notable Findings



- Although the opinion environment is a largely placid one, with a great deal of contentment and satisfaction with the quality of education, sensitivity to taxes is casting a cloud over the ideas of funding for operational and building needs
- Parents and non-parents appear philosophically committed to the highest quality of education, but the levy simulation show tenuous support, which may be affected by timing, but also ambivalence among older voters and non-parents who, among other characteristics, are less attuned to the district's financial woes
- There seems to be complacency about building conditions, even among some parents, and the limited support for the bond issue funding is being driven, in part, by the resulting absence of urgency...as well as the cost
- Despite that, most of the elements of the building plan are popular ones that warrant discussion during the dialog with the public about why facility revitalization is needed. Impressively, even many seniors and those who oppose the bond issue agree with the central premise that facility modernization is important
- The least popular aspect, which could divide the community, is consolidating the junior and senior high schools, which received tepid responses from both parents and non-parents and, intuitively, could be an emotionally-charged topic that undermines support for the idea
- A closing note is that, despite challenges facing the district to build consensuses about funding needs for operations and buildings, it is important to note that even dissenters give the district good marks for the quality of education, which indicates that opposition to the ideas tested has little or nothing to do with what is happening in the classrooms. As a result, the public discussion leading up to the decisions can focus on the needs and merits of the prospective requests
