# When can a student attend Chardon Kindergarten?

- Must be 5 on or before August 1st of the year they enter kindergarten.
- Early Entrance to kindergarten is considered whole grade acceleration
- A parent may request early admission
- Evaluation Required



# Bus Stop Safety

*Important behaviors at the bus stop include:* 

- Arriving to the bus stop 5 minutes prior to scheduled pick up time
- Make sure your student has a designated "Safe Spot" that is 12 feet away from traffic
- Once the bus arrives, make sure the bus is completely stopped and the doors are open before your child's starts walking towards the bus to board
- Make sure your child knows about the safety zone around the bus, and never walks in the "Danger Zone" (pictured in the next slide)
- If your child is crossing the road to get on the bus, make sure they wait for the driver to signal that it is safe. The driver will have their hand up while looking for danger, and lower it once they know it is safe for your child to cross.

Always remember- a blowing bus horn when entering or exiting the bus means danger- look and find safety



# Respectful Riding

*Important behaviors while riding the bus include:* 

- Making sure your child knows that after entering the bus, they should go directly to their assigned seat and sit down
- Once on the bus, students should make sure they always keep their bodies out of the aisle and inside the bus
- Using an inside voice on the bus is very important. Remember, the drivers are focusing on the road and making sure your child gets to and from school safely every day. Yelling and loud voices only take away from the drivers focus on the road
- Make sure your child knows to listen to the bus driver. Riding the bus is a privilege, and there are consequences for unsafe behavior. In the event of a Behavior Referral, the school principal will handle any disciplinary actions and speak with the parent/guardian.



#### 1. Download the BusRight App

Find BusRight on the Google Play or Apple App Store by clicking below.





#### 2. Sign Up for an Account

Sign up for an account in the app using the email you were invited with. Then, verify your email.

#### 3. Log In to Your Account

Log in to your account using the credentials you just created.

#### 4. View Your Child's Routes

Start viewing your child's routes & track their bus. Get ETAs in real time as they go to and from school.

Switch routes to view morning and afternoon runs or routes for multiple students.

View the real-time ETA to your child's stop.

Manage notification settings to receive alerts when your child's bus starts its trip and arrives at their stop.

# Bus Tracking App -Downloading and Using

Chardon Transportation uses the app BusRight for bus tracking. BusRight allows parents to see scheduled pickup and drop off times, along with real time ETA's daily, that change if the bus is ever late or early.

Parents can view who their child's bus driver is, bus number, and more!

Parents and users also get notifications if your child's route is delayed for any reason, or if there are ever any route changes.

Traffic Delay: Rowan's bus will be late because of traffic. Estimated arrival changed to 2:45pm.

Weather Delay: Skye's bus will be late because of the snow. Pickup moved to 8:05am.

#### Pre-Kindergarten Skills Checklist

Please review these skills with your child over the summer.

#### Bathroom and Self-Care

- Flush the toilet
- Use toilet paper
- Wash hands
- Respect privacy
- Blow nose appropriately

#### Social Skills

- Listen when someone is talking
- Keep hands to self
- Share and express feelings
- Manage emotions with words

#### Clothing

- Dress independently
- Button, snap, and zip
- Take off jacket or sweater
- Put on shoes

#### **Daily Routines**

- Follow a bedtime routine
- Make it through the day without a nap
- Eat a meal in 30 minutes

#### Mealtime Etiquette

- Open and close containers
- Use utensils to eat
- Use napkins to wipe face and hands
- Sit down when eating

#### Academics

- Write first name
- Count to 20
- ☐ Sing the ABC's
- Play appropriately with pencils, crayons, scissors, and glue
